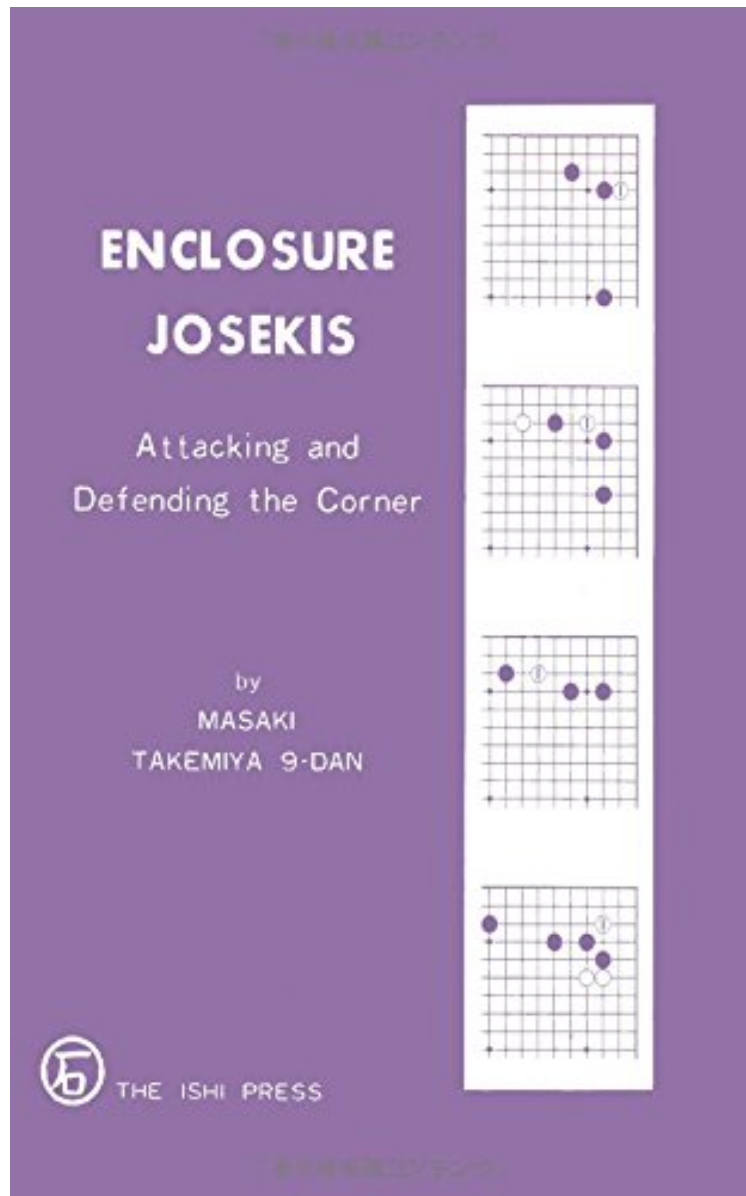

I am about 7 kyu on Tygem and found this book very helpful, it contains a lot of examples (probably hundreds including all variations including good and bad moves) of common shape invasion

especially invading framework developed around 3-4 point, which is exactly what I needed. I have two other books that takes about invasion and both of them only talks about invading star point. I can't speak for all player but I feel like this is worth read even for higher level players and for lower level player it can at least give you an idea of where is the vital point to invade however, this book doesn't teach you when to invade or which variation to pick. Enclosure Josekis This book is a practical guide to the art of invading a corner position where the opponent has already made an enclosure. It covers, in a dictionary format, the basic patterns that come up repeatedly in one's games. The patterns are: the small knight enclosure, the large knight enclosure, the one-space enclosure (from the 3-4 point), the star point enclosure. There is also a supplementary chapter on three other common formations 'Enclosure Josekis' teaches the invader how to live inside the opponent's position by making light and flexible shape. It also shows the defender the proper way to deal with an invasion so that he gets adequate compensation even if the defender lives. This book will sharpen up your middle game and make you a master of the endgame.

About the Author Masaki Takemiya was born on 1 January 1951 in Japan. He became a disciple of Tanaka Minaichi 6-dan, then entered the Kitani school in 1965. He became a shodan in the same year, then rose a dan a year, reaching 6-dan in 1970. He made 7-dan in 1972, 8-dan in 1975 and 9-dan in 1977. Takemiya attracted early attention as a member of the 'Kitani school trio', of which Ishida and Kato were the other members. As a 2-dan he earned the nickname "9 dan killer" for his precocious success against top ranked players. In 1969 he took 8th place in the Pro Best Ten, then unsuccessfully challenged Ishida for the Nihon KI-in Championship. In 1971 and 1973 he won the Kodansha (high dan players) tournament. In 1976 he won the 31st Honinbo title, then the 35th Honinbo title in 1980. He has also won two TV haya-go tournaments. Takemiya is best known for his bold and adventurous go style: He plays on a grand scale, building large moyos and emphasizing the center.
