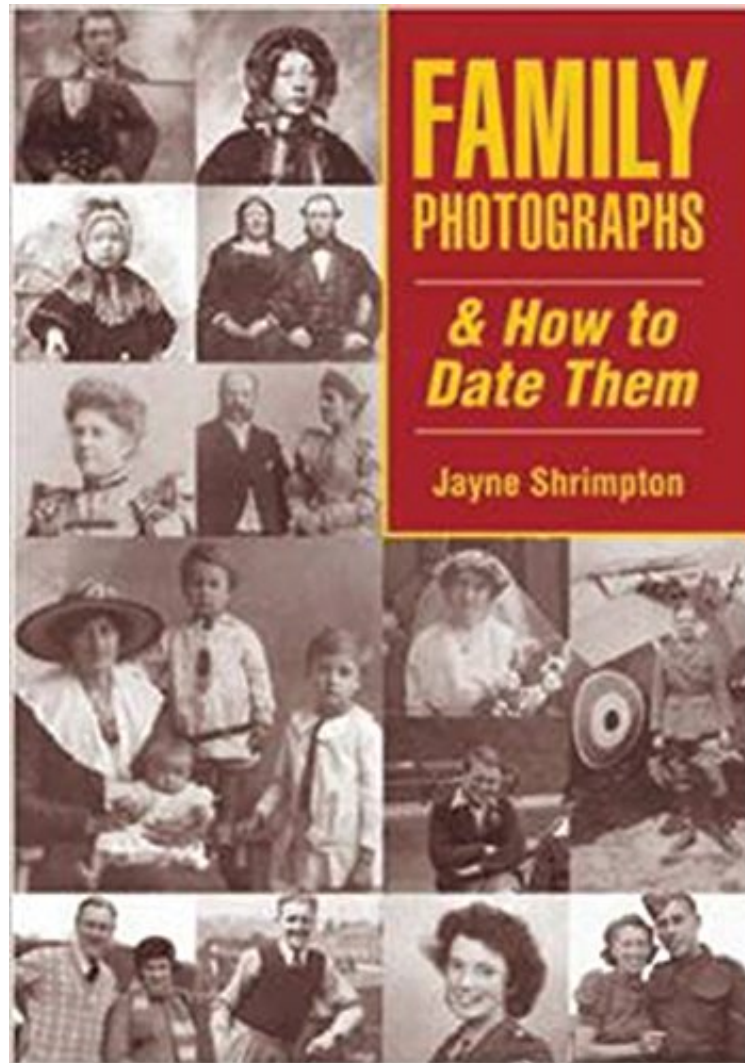

Dating by FashionBy Cindy VojnovicI'm not sure why the book uses "Family Photographs" in the title; there is nothing in the book addressed to family photographs in particular. What the book does is approach dating almost entirely by the fashions worn by the subjects. The value of this book over fashion books is that it shows photos from all walks of life, not high fashion photographs, but the ordinary sorts of photographs you are likely to encounter in your family albums.Many of the photos were not of high quality; as

someone who has extensive scanning, retouching and pre-press experience, I know for a fact that even the oldest most damaged photos reproduced could have been optimized to the extent that they would have been much easier to "read." It's possible that lack of quality scanning actually reduced the legibility of the photos; but without seeing the originals, I can't know for sure. That being said, I still think this book is an extremely valuable resource, and don't regret my purchase!

Jayne Shrimpton's book covers 100 years of family photographs from 1850 to 1950. Each decade has its own chapter, with an introduction followed by a wide range of photographs to show its fashion styles for men, women and children. The book is profusely pictorial, illustrated with over 230 photographs, and offers a brilliant guide to dating our precious photographic heirlooms.
