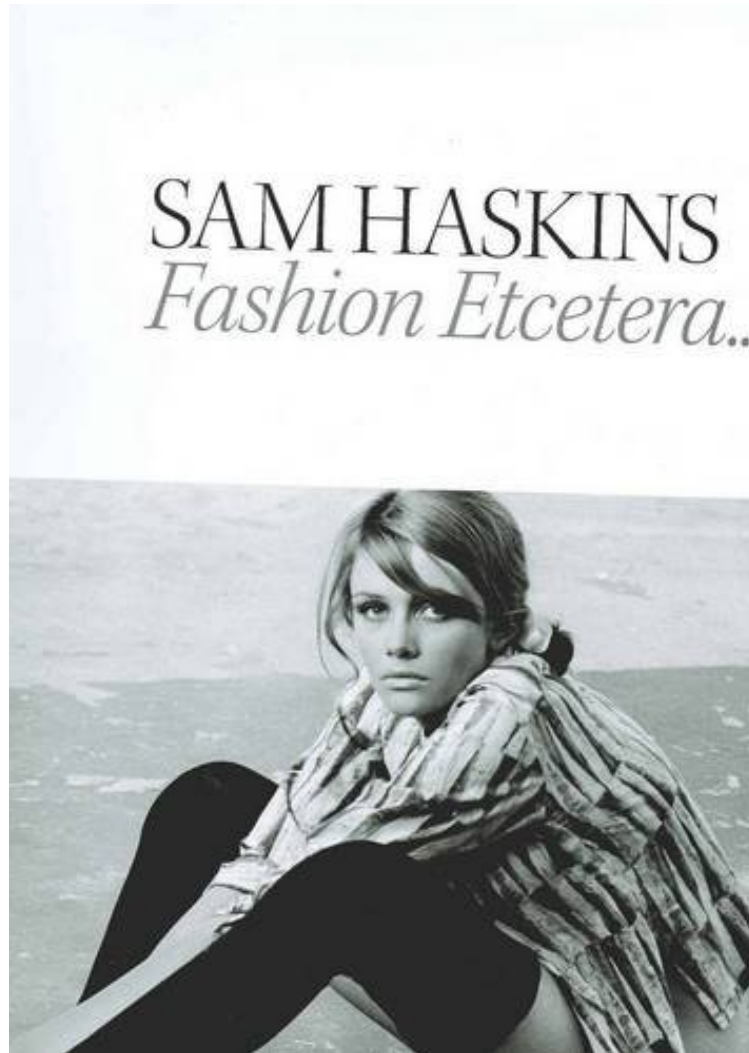


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## Fashion Etcetera...

tribute to this master photographer. Here was a terrifically talented, creative, and technically astute photographer whose images were fresh, witty, and frequently striking. Fortunately, we at least have this fine collection to serve as a testament to his brilliance. This is not merely representative of the photographer's fashion work. The reader is treated to a full overview of Haskins' most familiar images - from Five Girls, Cowboy Kate, Haskins Posters, African Image, the Pentax calendars, and his latest work prior to his death in 2009. His work is arranged in chronological order, and each period opens with a brief description from Haskins to carry the reader through. Frankly, I wish there had been a little more text, perhaps biographical even, as there is so little known about this great photographer.
