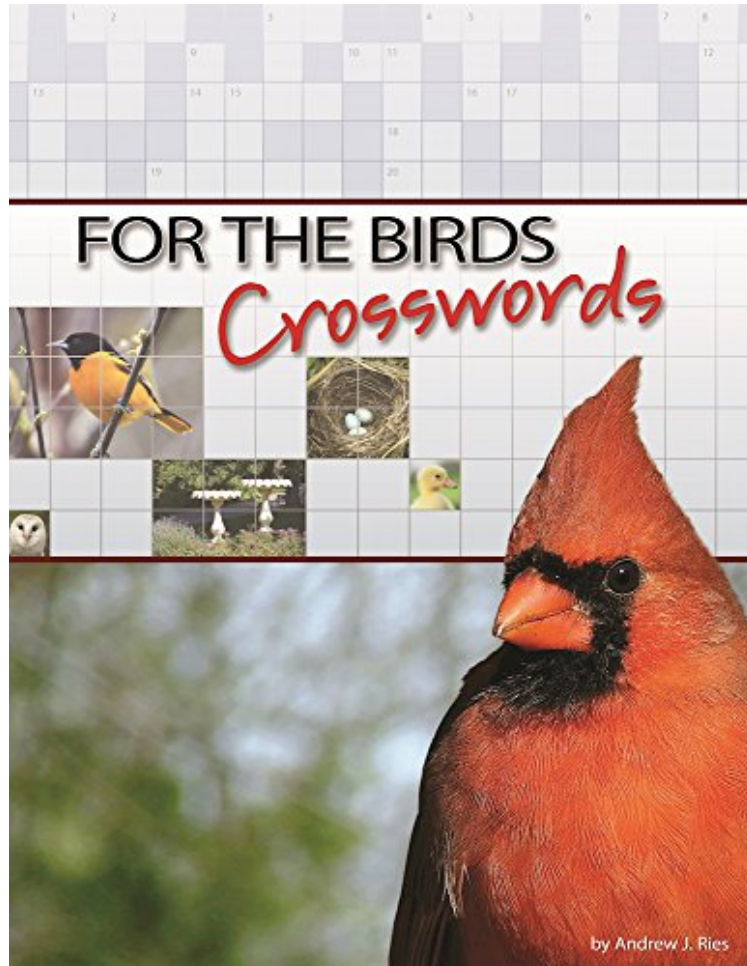

It was very disappointing that there was extremely little about birds. And mostly the questions that had bird-related things in it, weren't really about actual birds. The writer even said that less than 1/4 of the crosswords had anything to do with birds. That "1/4" probably even

included questions with bird words in them, but not really about birds. (Bird-brained, Falcon Crest, etc.)I'm not sure why the front of the book has all the bird pics on it. Its just very misleading. And the puzzle hints are very esoteric.I'm very disappointed and wouldn't recommend it.
