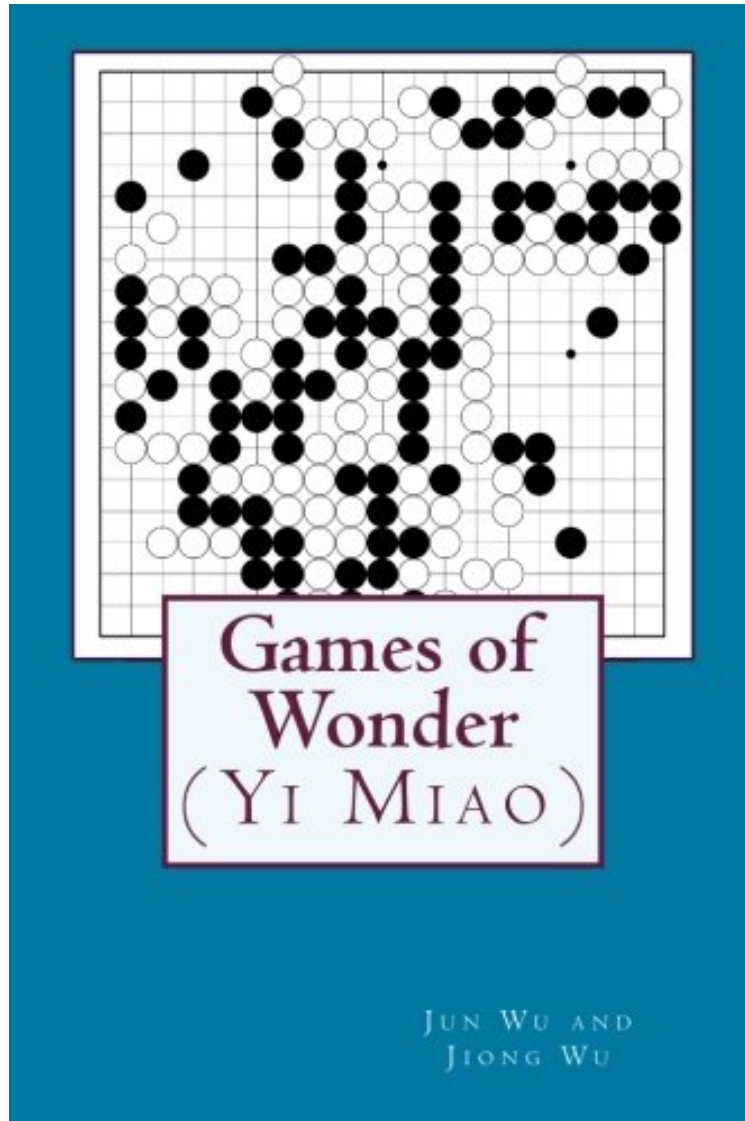

I appreciate that this classic game collection has been made available to western players. But I wanted to point out that this book contains game records only, not commentary on the games. This was not clear to me from the description. Overall the book seems high quality, good paper, readable diagrams.

Every diagram has exactly 50 moves (except for final diagrams of each game which often seem to have the 50-100 final moves), so no editorial commentary is even used to break the game up into chunks (opening, individual joseki, middle game, etc.). 3 of 3 people found the following review helpful.
