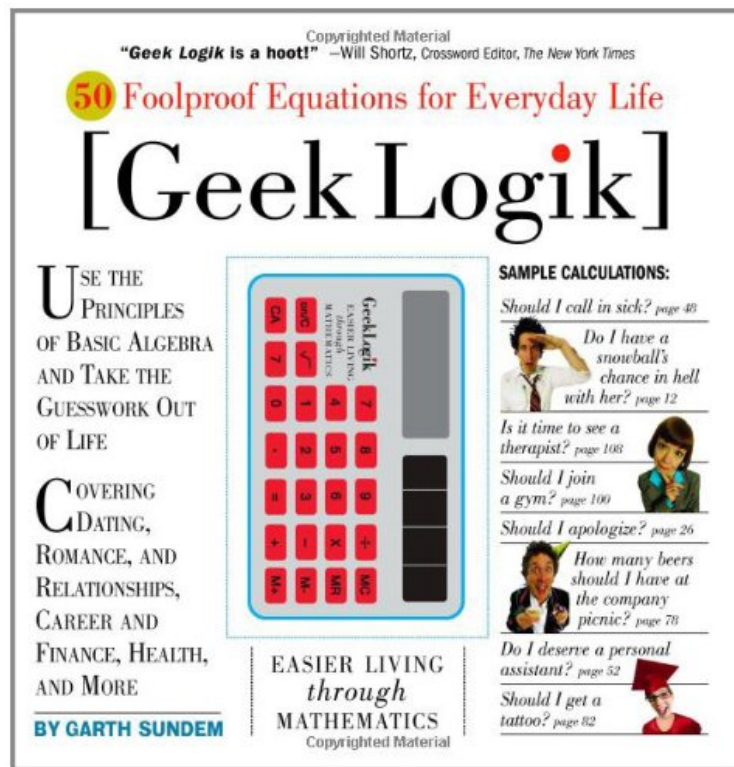

I blame myself for not looking inside the book (or even judging by the cover) and expected something on a more serious side.If you are hoping to find some practical, actually usable equations/graphs based on some scientific studies of some sort, this is not the book for you. The ones presented in the book are essentially whacky, humorous, "overly complex" equations with 6-8 or more variables, with the majority of the variables are actually just subjective rating values on a scale of 1-10. The author even lightly suggested, "you can adjust the equations by adding more variables to suit your needs."So I spent around 15 minutes skimming over some of equations (especially those dealing with less clichd topics, yay I can still wear speedos) and read some of descriptions and quickly put it to rest.On the other hand, this book makes a great gift for fellow geeks, I suppose.1 of 2 people found the following review helpful.
