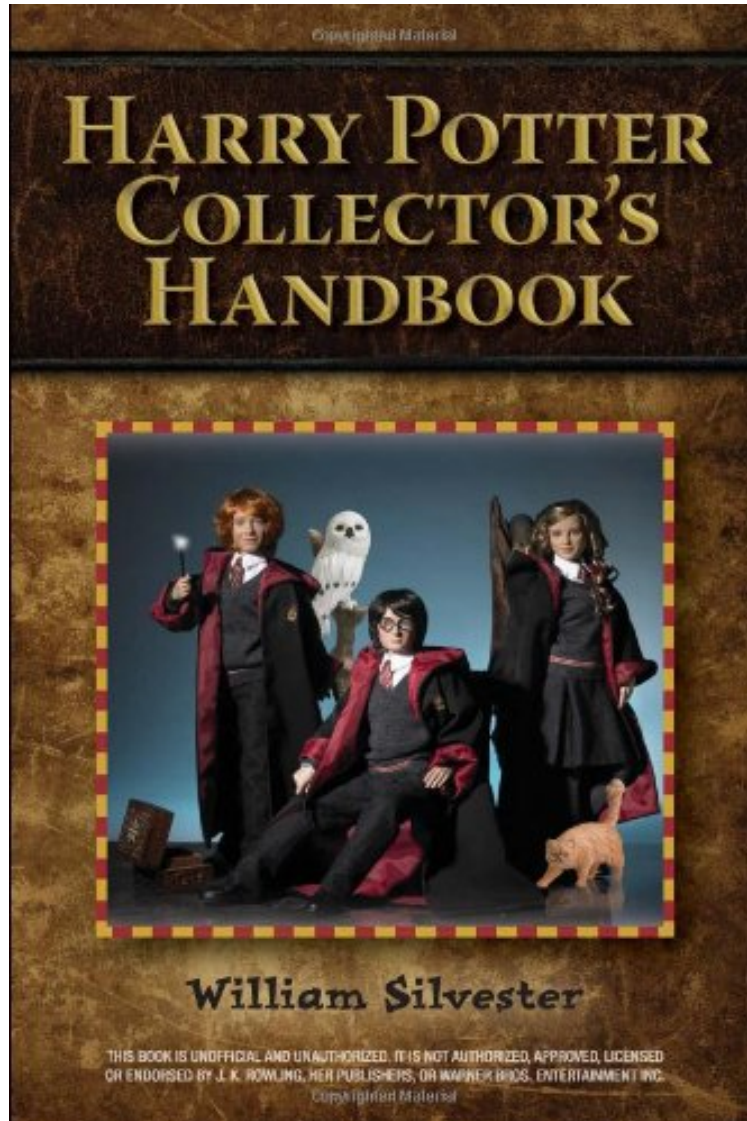

Naturally it is impossible to include everything with the world wide popularity of the Harry Potter series, so I was not surprised to find some of my rarer items, such as a couple of rarer dolls from Europe. I was a little surprised the Gotz trio of Harry, Ron and Hermione were not included, since they were the first "big name" dolls produced (literary versions). They were not released in the U.S., though, so that could be part of the reason they are missing. The biggest surprise for me was that the Tonner section is missing the Professor Snape doll as well as the newer 12" line that was released last year.

Readers will find hundreds of colour images and current secondary market values of collectibles based on boy wizard Harry Potter, ranging from rare first editions of the bestsellers by J.K. Rowling to more commonplace items such as ornaments, stamps, action figures, toys, jewellery, clothing, costumes, and postcards. The book includes a history of the pop culture icon as well as general background information on the hobby, what's most collectible, and why. Prices range from a few dollars for a Harry Potter action figure to several thousand for a first edition book.
