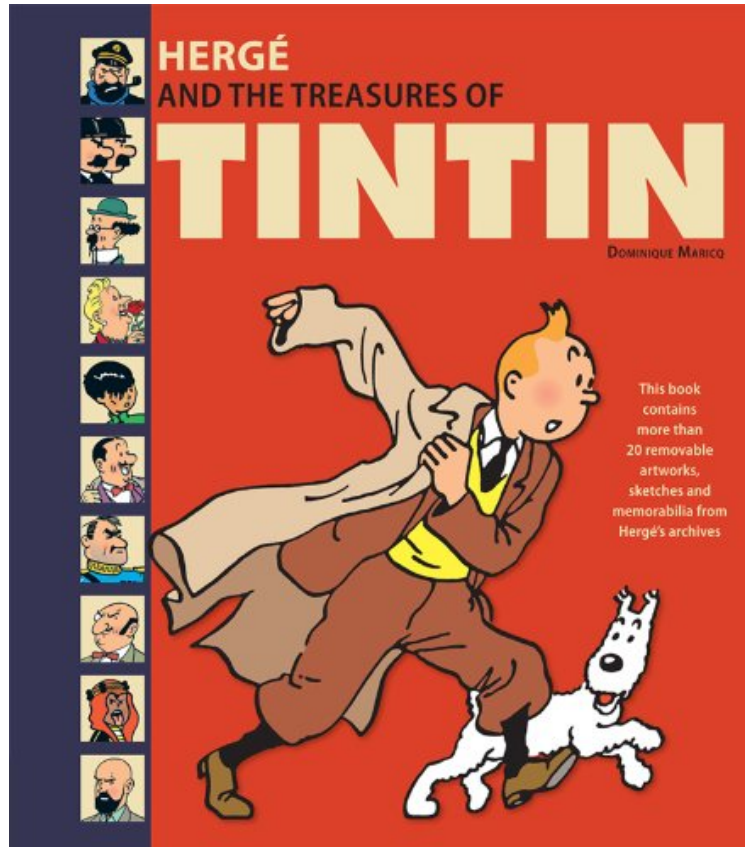

Published by Editions Moulinsart and written by Dominique Maricq an archivist at Studios Hergé book this book beautifully presented with a cushioned cover and high quality paper and printing. The book is divided into four sections after a brief introduction.1. 1929-1940 From Spontaneity to Mastery2. 1940-1944 The golden Age3. 1946-1960 Maturity4. 1960-1983 A Legend is EstablishedThere is also a conclusion with the title "Hergé Thirty Years Later". Each section has a subsection dealing with each Tintin Adventure and gives between four and six small paragraphs of information as well as illustrations many of which I have not seen before. This is pretty amazing because I own eight books on Tintin, and I thought I had pretty much seen it all. An extra bonus is that in six pockets the book contains a total of 22 facsimiles of drawings, posters, greeting cards, vignettes, announcements etc. (One word of warning, some of the are difficult to put back in the envelopes due to tight fits, so take extra care to keep them in pristine condition)So, if you like Tintin, You should really get this book before it goes out of print.Review by Walter O.
