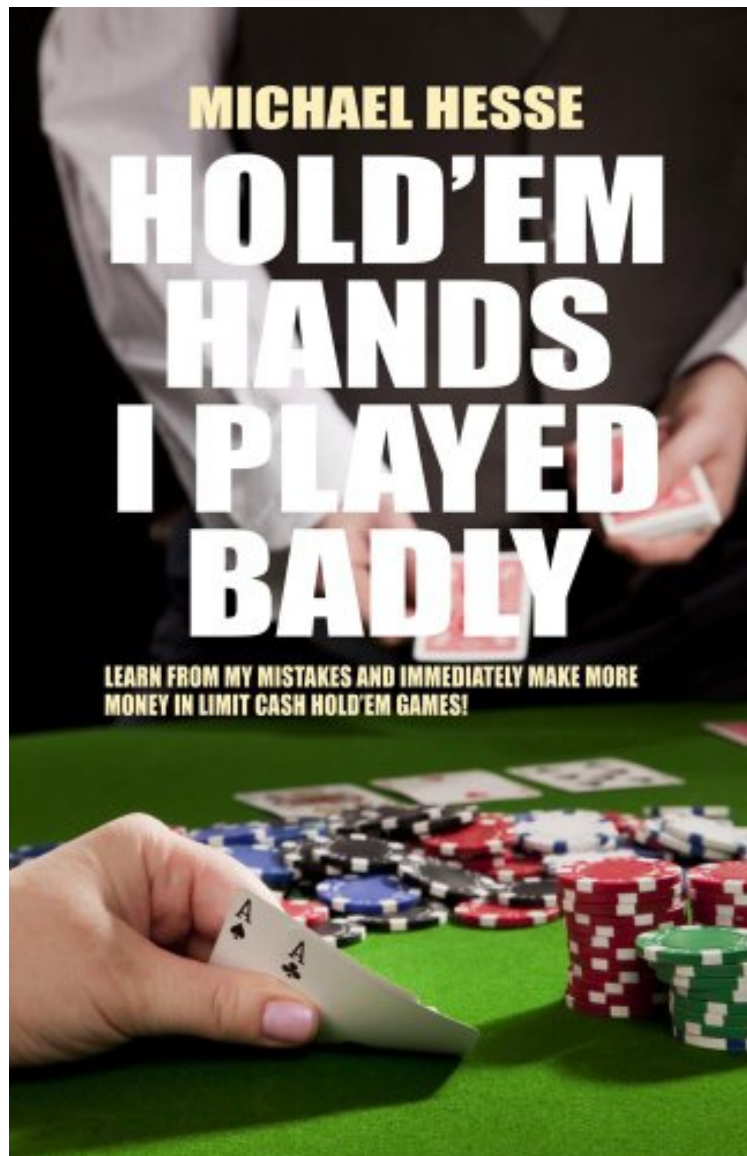

The premise of this book that you can do more to improve your results, by eliminating mistakes than by learning new brilliant plays. A big portion of the book is

analysis of actual hands explaining why certain common plays are mistakes and how to recognize these situations at the table. However, there is quite a bit of other new material. The Rule of 42 will make figuring pot odds and outs much simpler at the table. The explanation of counting outs will probably be the most complete and accurate you have ever read. The analysis of suited and un-suited connectors should give you a better understanding of how to play these hands.
