Once a player has learned the basics of hold'em, the next step is to think about how the opponents are playing their cards. A good player knows how to react to how the opponents are playing. JohnsonThis is a good companion to Poker Math That Matters - Simplifying the Secrets of No-limit Hold'em, Owen's other book.It uses the same format, with quizzes after each chapter, to help the knowledge sink in.He has a few different ways of looking at a players range, instead of just saying cards like A10+ and 77+ he uses graphs that a certain type of player would use.
