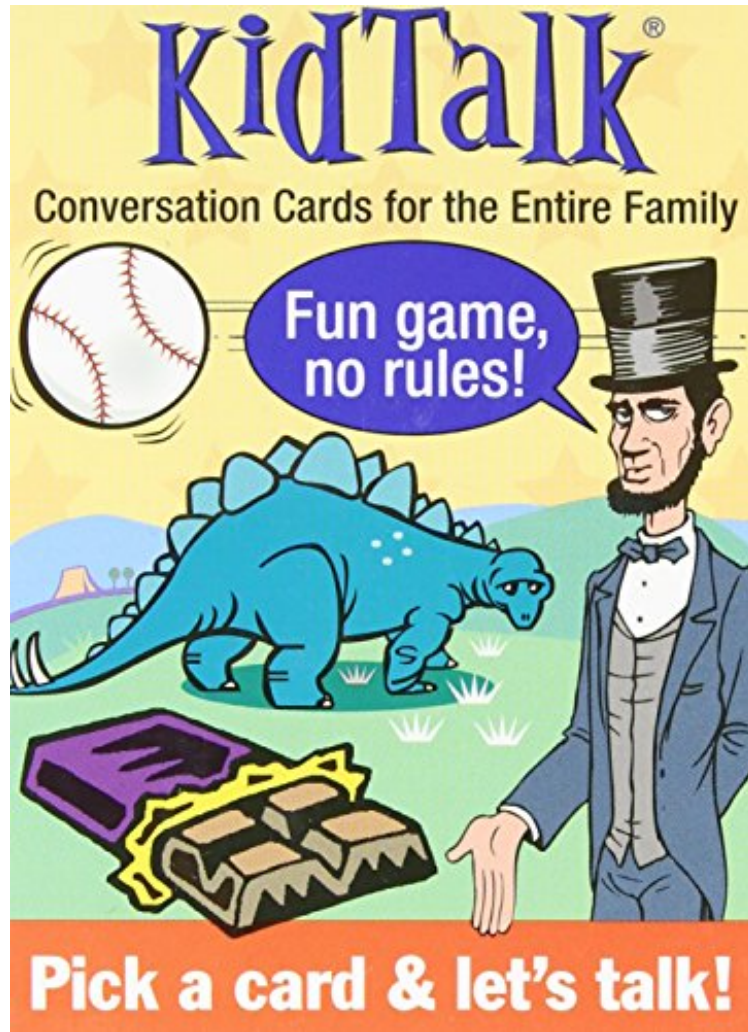

As a result, I always make a point of asking them open-ended, non yes-or-no questions when we're together. ("What was good about your day today?" vs. "Did you have a good day today?") In this regard, KidTalk has proven itself to be a popular and practical pastime on several important levels.(1) The cards are organized by multiple subject areas, which are color-coded; so each boy alternatively picks the next question card to be answered from a different section than the preceding question.(2) Each question card has two sections: The first, longer paragraph gives context to the subject. The second, short paragraph, solicits the personal opinion of the child on that subject. So, the older brother, who's the better reader, reads the first paragraph and then hands the card to his younger brother, who reads the shorter, second paragraph. Then everyone (often we do this in the car) offers his or her response. And so on...Thanks to KidTalk, we have had so much fun and so many interesting discussions that it is now part of every road trip. In addition to helping the boys with their reading, it has inspired discussions that we may never have had! Thank you, thank you. When will Version 2 be released?
