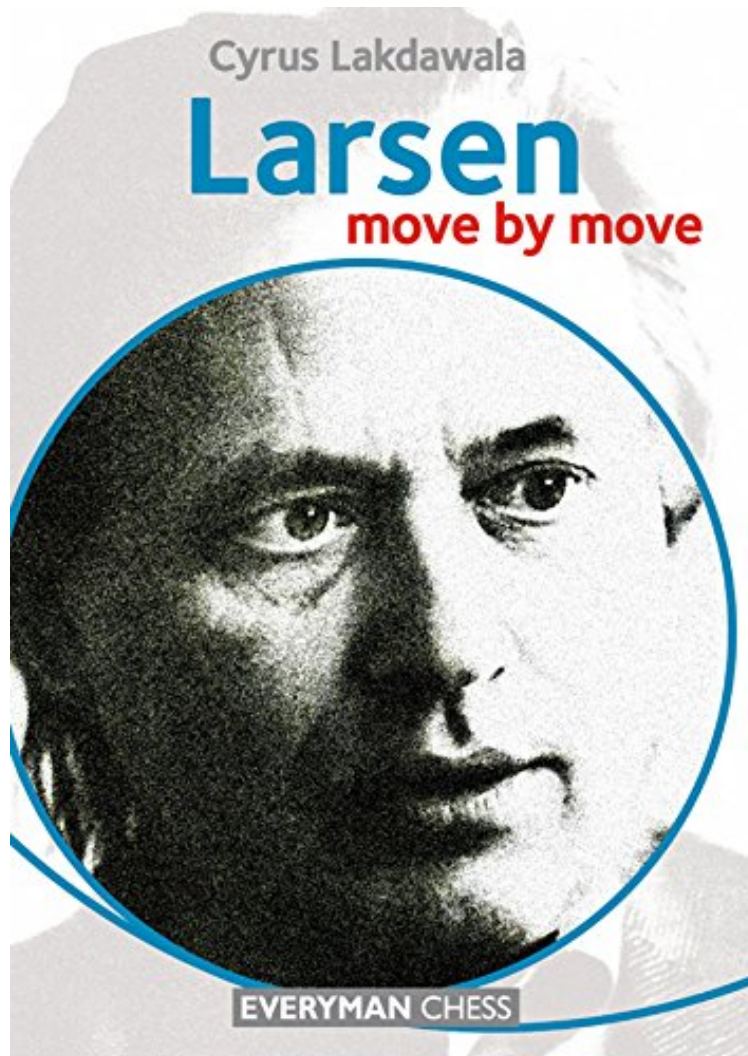

This is supposed to be a chess book, not a collection of idiosyncratic essays. Perhaps the author fancies himself a 19th century man of letters -- but his style is singularly inappropriate for annotating chess games.

Bent Larsen was one of the most influential chess players of the 20th century. He was a four-time Candidate for the

World Championship and the first westerner to seriously challenge the Soviet Union's post-war dominance of the game. Larsen was admired by fans for his creative and combative style. He was a risk-taker who always sought complex positions. He felt completely at home in defense and was an opportunistic attacker. While other grandmasters would shy away from offbeat openings, Larsen would embrace and develop them. In this book, former American Open Champion Cyrus Lakdawala studies his favourite Larsen games and examines Larsen's skills in the key areas of attack and defense, initiative, exploiting imbalances, accumulating advantages and endgame play. He demonstrates clearly how we can all improve by learning from Larsen's play. Move by Move provides an ideal platform to study chess.
