The first thing you notice is the well articulated and nuanced writing style. Clear and concise. A sign of exceptional intellect. This book was ranked among the most advanced studies of middle game that had been ever offered when originally published in Russia. Required reading in the Soviet school of chess, no doubt! In the

intervening years it is unlikely anything has surpassed it, at least nothing I have come across. It is still an amazing and comprehensive study guide. I look forward to slowly working through all 400+ pages. I cannot imagine one reading this book and not increasing markedly in strength. I will not go into the details of what is covered here as others have already done so - just be aware that essential concepts are covered here in some depth. You will not be disappointed. I will just emphasize again that the game annotations were very enlightening and that the teaching style was very accessible while remaining very scholarly in tone. A very professional and polished presentation, something often missing in books these days. I was surprised to see Gary Kasparov's name show up in the name index. No, not for his games per se, but rather just a few of his own brief annotations to several historical games used throughout the book. This was an unexpected bonus. Somebody has gone through and added footnotes from contemporary GMs to the annotations. A very nice touch and it shows the care that went into compiling this book for the English translation. Nice job! Somebody cared enough to do it the right way. No shortcuts. The book itself is of the highest quality. I have the paperback edition and it is surprisingly heavy due to the high grade paper. The layout is nicely done and the diagrams are particularly clear and easy to read. A very nice quality book to own. Worth every penny. Should last for years. We should be thankful that Quality Chess took up this project and reprinted this book, There is a saying: Don't miss any single opportunity to learn something new. That's one of those opportunities. The only drawback would be that like a book like "My System", it has aged gracefully, and there are certainly more modern, up to date books on middle game play.
