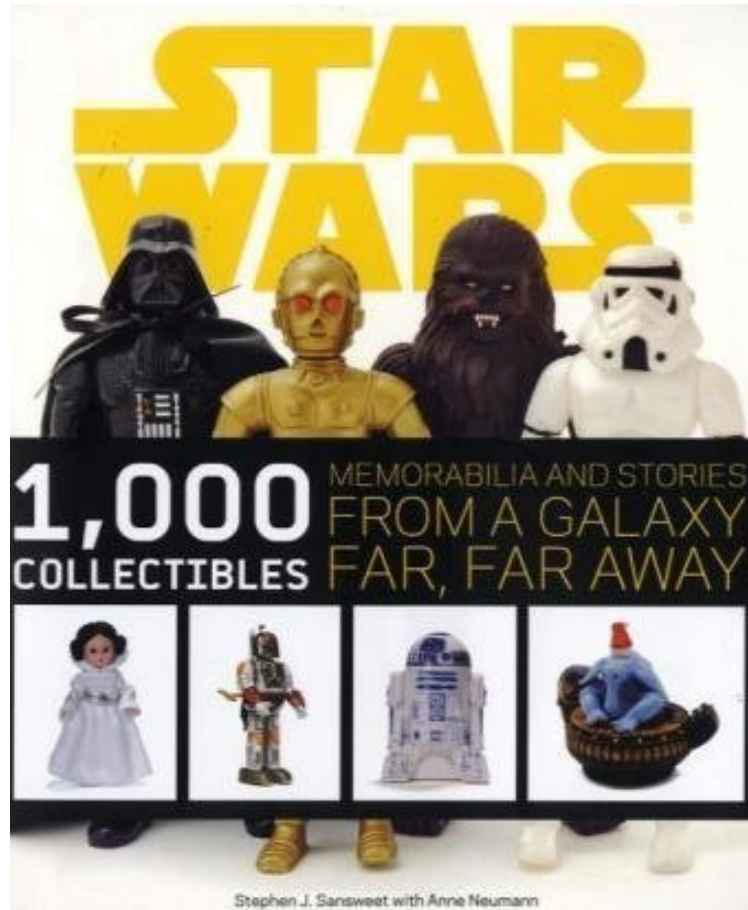

This is an absolutely wonderful cross-section of his collection, with some lovely little stories about the items or how they came into his collection. I don't care how much of a fan of Star Wars you are, I guarantee that there are many collectibles in this book you've never heard of, or have heard of but never seen, and some you are probably going try to search for to own for yourself.
