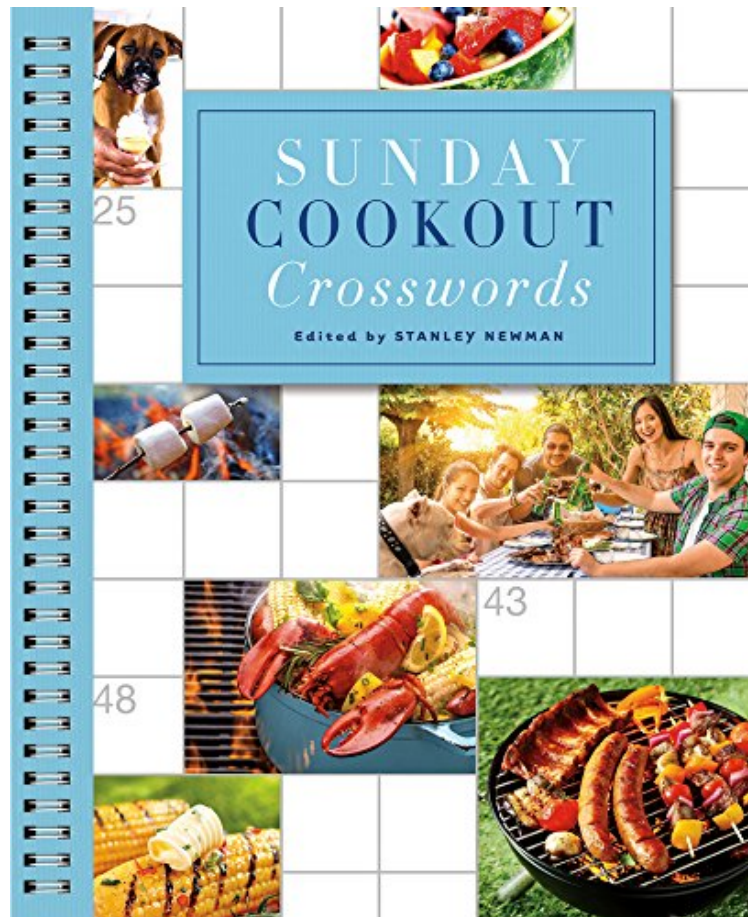

I like that these puzzles use wordplay, both in the clues and the themes, yet the clues tend to be contemporary and accessible, with a minimum of archaic language or minutia.
