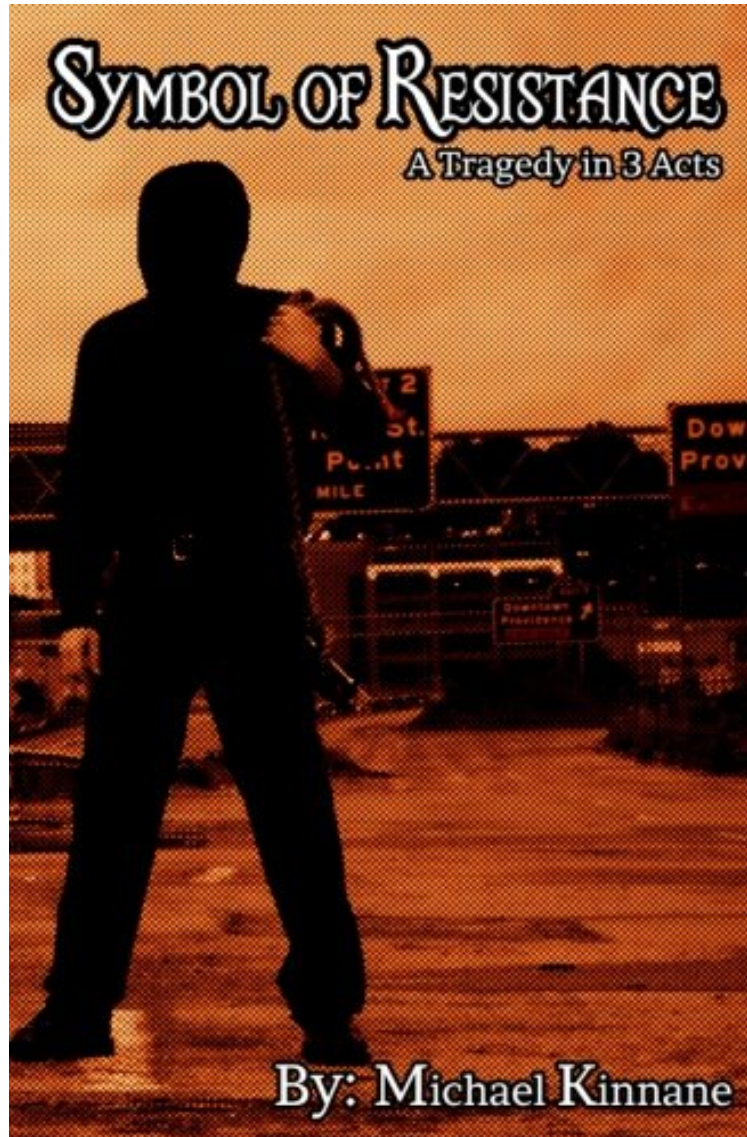

When Paxton, a homeless man, sees the arsonists as a call to action against local corruption, he seeks to join them. Convinced they can be used as a tool for economic justice, he preaches a unique philosophy of passion only to find it may be falling on deaf ears. Can Paxton convince his family, his friends, and the terrorists that the heart of man can be preserved, while at the same time, acting like a monster? Or is Paxton's heart already consumed by flame?

About the Author Michael Kinnane is a playwright and author from Rhode Island currently living in economic exile in Arizona. He graduated in 2007 with a B.A. in Theatre from Rhode Island College before moving from the fearful east to the desert with the nothing but the clothes on his back. He has worked closely with community theatres and has written more than a half dozen stage plays mostly focusing on Theatre of the Absurd, Tragedy, and the stress of the common man being thrust into difficult choices. His work, with one foot firmly planted in reality, provides social commentary while taking a single uncomfortable stride into the unknown; its strangeness and its horror.
