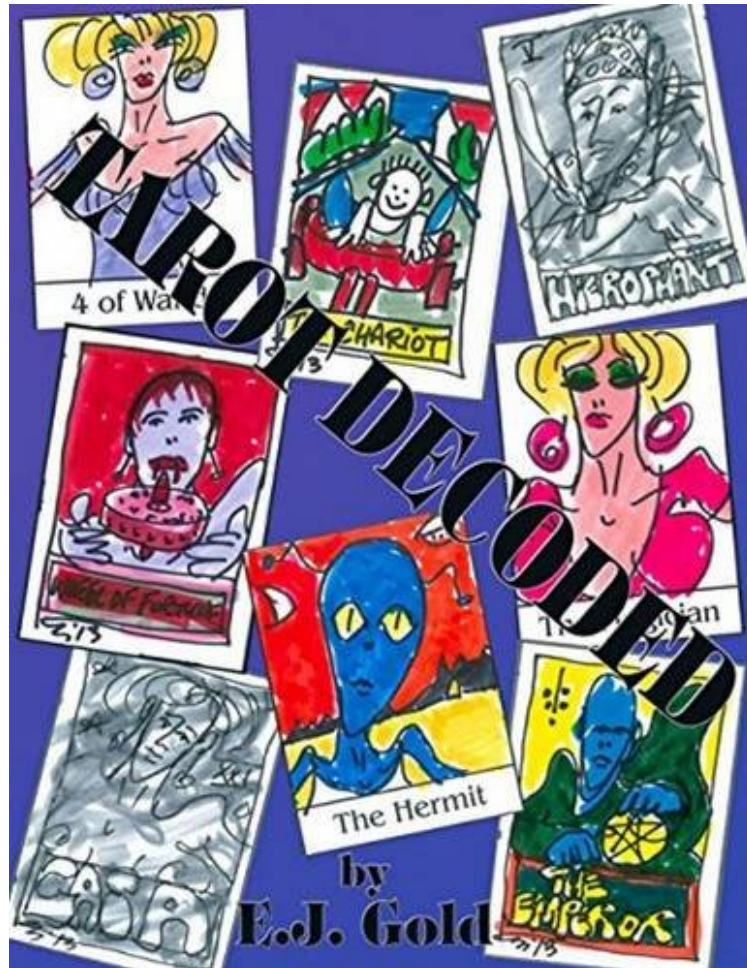

By Soulmakerproductions Although I've been reading Tarot for many years, I really enjoyed exploring E. J. Gold's interpretations of the cards, as there was a simplicity and depth to the book. It's easy to use if you are a 'newbie', as the spiral bound format allows you to place the card right above the interpretation for easy learning. By

learning to pay attention to the imagery in the card, you are able to access your own interpretations and understandings rather than memorizing rote meanings. I encourages learning the cards not through a mental process but a multi-level one that encourages your own understandings and intuitions. He says in the introduction: "You can learn to use the tarot as a tool of guidance, as a tool of initiation, self-revelation and self-study." On the other hand, it has a non-traditional interpretation of the Pentacles suit as 'Spirit' and many of the meanings have a strong 'Gurdjieff' flavor...for example the interpretation of the VII of Pentacles - "He's taken a look, stepped back to observe how a spiritual growth is developing before he goes on. He's very definitely work on his spiritual...and very hard." I feel that I gained additional perspectives and insights into the images and connected with the tarot as an ongoing, ever-expanding journey of self understanding. Tarot Decoded by E. J. A tarot book like no other By Andrew Bishop At first glance Tarot Decoded seemed like a book simply describing the meanings of the cards. After going through the material, I realised that much more is also going on. The book seems to demonstrate how to be open to the cards so that they can be allowed to generate impressions, forgoing the need for a list of definitions or external consultation. This enables the reader to get started very quickly and proceed based on experience rather than memorisation. Taking a journey through this book with your deck (any deck) will provide the best introduction to tarot that I know of. A very unique approach, highly recommended.

A manual for the tarot card novice that shows how to set up the first tarot card layout and begin to give tarot readings This simple, step-by-step guide to beginning tarot readings contains diagrams of the card layouts and a discussion of all of the cards in the tarot deck. The books method is to present a card-sized outline on each page in which the reader can place the appropriate card from his/her tarot deck. A general meaning is given, and the reader is invited to study each card and expand the associations with the cards in a personal way. Also included is an essay on some of the esoteric meanings of the minor arcana cards, which are the most challenging for a beginning tarot reader.
