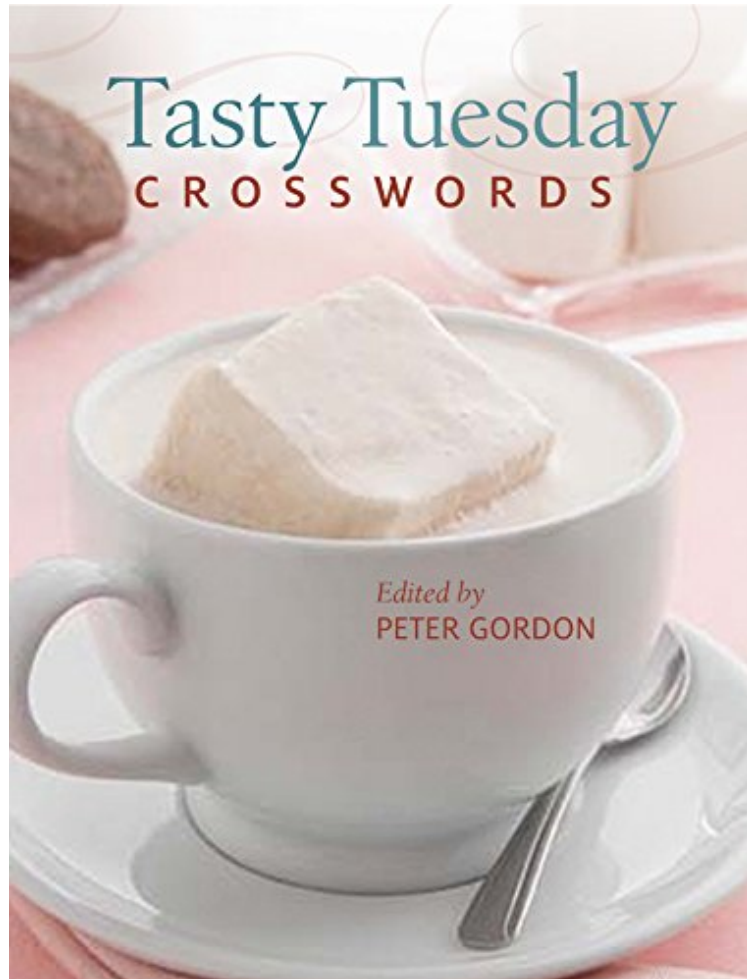

great crossword puzzle book for me - it's hard to find puzzles that are neither too hard nor too easy. The puzzles get harder as the days of the week progress, so to speak. So Monday puzzles are the easiest, Tuesday a bit harder, etc. My ability is at the level of doing the local newspaper's daily crossword, including Sundays, but I doubt I will ever be able to do the New York Times' Sunday crossword puzzle. This book is also nice because it is spiral bound and the paper is good quality, not newsprint. Costello This is a book of puzzles of all approximately the same difficulty level. These are not NYT puzzles, but the daily difficulty levels are similar (Monday=easiest through Saturday=hardest). There is a variety of different constructors contributing puzzles, including some well-known names, and they seem close to the quality of NYT puzzles. The paper quality is good, and the spiral binding is essential to a good puzzle book. I don't know about the dessert theme of the series, however... makes me hungry! I bought this volume for my daughter. (I'm a Wednesday-Thursday guy myself...)
